

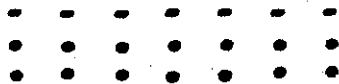

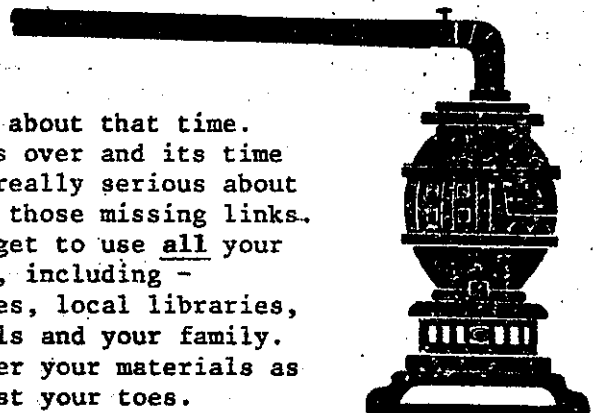

Emanuel was son of Aaron & Hannah (COON). Emanuel raised 16 ch. His son Lemuel md in 1866 Martha FIELDS, dau. of Crabtree & Belinda (BELCHER) who came to this county in 1805.

PEMBERTON, ELLIOTT b in this county, 8-4-1832, son of John who came here from Kanawha Co., Va. in 1822. John md Mary I. CORBIN. Elliott md Emmaetta BRAMMER b in this county 12-18-1838, dau. of Elijah G. & Anna (LANGDON). Had 9 ch.

Ironton Soliloquy Coal Grove Had Other Names

REMAINS OF OLD MONITOR FOUND — Highway construction crews working near the Norfolk & Western depot at Coal Grove removing tons of earth for the new US 52 Expressway have uncovered huge stone base of old Monitor pig iron furnace near the Carlyle Tile Co. plant . . . Monitor Furnace was built there 97 years ago . . . We understand there is not a person living who remembers that old furnace, but several recall the stone stack that remained there until the early part of this century.

Old Monitor, as we patch the story together, was built in 1868, by Bird, Peters & Co. who owned Lawrence Furnace on the old Iron Railroad about ten miles north of Ironton . . . The Civil War was just over when Monitor was built and a number of Lawrence County "Iron Masters" were very wealthy at that time . . . Up until then all pig iron furnaces had been built in the hills where iron ore was easy to mine and trees were plentiful to chop wood for charcoal . . . The greatest expense the furnace owners had was to haul their finished product over the hills in ox carts to the wharf in Ironton for shipment by boat to Pittsburgh or Cincinnati markets where it was sold.

The men who organized Monitor had an idea that it would be less expensive building a furnace near the river where iron could be loaded on the boats without hauling it so far over the hills which was costly . . . What they overlooked was that it took twice as much ore hauling and cordwood handling to make a load of pig iron, hence it cost more to make iron on the river bank than it did to make it 3 to 10 miles from the river.

The story is that Monitor Furnace never made a dime . . . Following the failure of the furnace the land became the property of John Peters and associates who started a successful fire brick plant at Monitor and the name of the post office was changed to Petersburg . . . Newton Post Office was on the hill, now known as Newton Cemetery . . . Sheridan Coal Works post office was two miles up river . . . When the Chicago Lumber Co. built the largest saw mill in the nation on the river bank at Ice Creek in 1889 the post office Coal Grove was established and Newton, Monitor, Petersburg and Sheridan Coal Works post offices were discontinued.

Lawrence Furnace built in 1834 ten miles north of Ironton made money . . . That site now is the junction where State Route 93 and Route 522 from Lawco Lake meet . . . The Bird family is all gone . . . E. J. Bird, Sr. was father of E. J. Bird, Jr. who later was superintendent at Big Elna Furnace and was colonel and band leader of the 17th Regimental Band, Ohio National Guard when Co. I left the city during the Spanish-American War . . . The Peters families, now in their fourth generation in city history, are few in number today . . . Those we remember since a boy all were associated with the pig iron industry . . . John Peters, Sr. who lived at Eighth and Park Avenue, was president of the industries; Charles Peters who lived at Sixth and Railroad was vice president and sales manager; George Peters lived at Culbertson post office not far from Lawrence Furnace and was secretary-treasurer . . . John Peters, Jr. general manager lived at Coal Grove and the old home where he lived for 75 years has just been razed in the path of the new expressway . . . That's the story of the changing scene in Coal Grove today . . . Because old Monitor wasn't a big success little was printed about it in the newspaper files we have found.
