NEW RESEARCH TOOL PUBLISHED

The 1787 Census of Virginia compiled by Netti Schreiner-Yantis and Florene Speakman Love has been published by Genealogical Books in Print, 6818 Lois Drive, Springfield, VA 22150 -in a composite hardbound edition of three vol. and in separate softbound booklets for each county in existence in 1787 in what are now the states of Virginia, West Virginia, and Kentucky. This is an especially valuable publication because of the loss of the 1790 federal census of VA.

The 1787 Census of Virginia, transcribed from personal property tax lists for that year is in some respects even more useful than the 1790 census would be were it available. Example: the census required only the names of males who were heads of households whereas the tax lists required the names of all free white males over twenty-one years. Also, in 1787 for the first time the tax commissioner called on taxable persons in his district and recorded the date of his visit. Although the commissioners arranged their lists in alphabetical order by the first letter of the surname of the taxable person, it has been possible to rearrange the lists by date visited and so reconstruct neighborhoods. The soft-bound books for individual counties list taxables in each district first alphabetically and then by date visited.

The 1787 Tax lists are missing for only 6 counties and one city. For those jurisdictions, 1786 and 1788 tax lists, petitions, and other contemporary records were used to help establish who was living there in 1787.

The three-volume, hardbound composite edition is available until 31 March 1988 at a prepublication price of \$175. plus \$4. postage and handling.

A computer printout for a particular surname, showing each individual of that surname and the county in which he is found is available for \$5.00 plus a long self-addressed envelop with 39 cents postage. A credit memo for the cost of the print out can then be applied to the purchase of county booklets. Write to above address for the books and/or printouts.

Phil Thuma read correspondence concerning Ohio Genealogical Society Convention at King's Island on April 15-17.

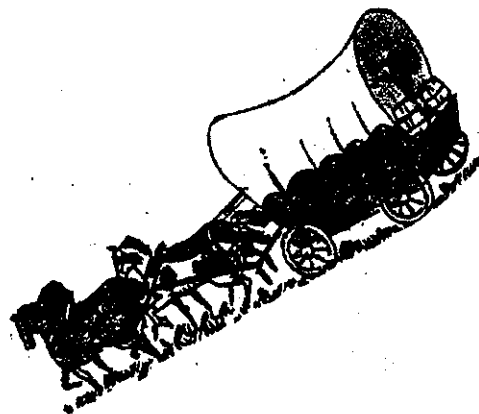
