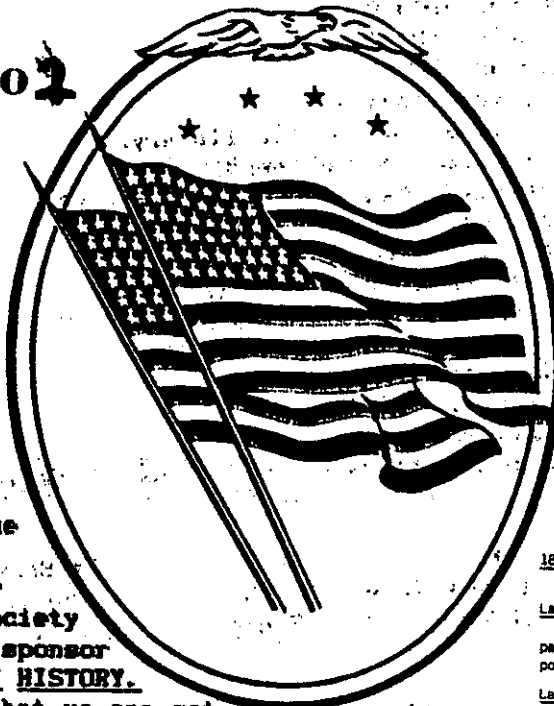
HISTORY OF

DO YOU KNOW WHO JOHN FARMER WAS?

He was a pioneer Genealogist that has been elected to the National Genealogical Society Hall of Fame. John Farmer (1789-1838) of Chelmsford, MA and his adopted state of New Hampshire. One of his greatest lasting achievements was the publication of the Genealogical Register of the First Settlers of New England in 1829. The author of the Genealogical Memoir of the Farmer Family, which was published 9 years after his death, wrote: "He investigated faithfully, took nothing upon trust, and rested on reasonable conclusions only where absolute certainty could not be attained."

Mr. Farmer's election follows those of Donald Lines Jacobus of Connecticut; Walter Goodwin Davis of Maine; Gilbert Cope of PA. Their portraits hang in the Hall of Fame in the Octagon Room of Glebe House, headquarter of the NGS in Arlington, VA. Visitors are welcome.

Virgil and Marguerite Ramsey have completed their History of the Charcoal Furnaces of the Hanging Rock Iron Region. This volume has information on the formation of the furnaces, a brief history of each furnace as well as maps, pictures of the remaining stacks and listings of the tombstone inscriptions for furnace cemeteries. There is a two page description of the operation of the furnaces. These furnaces once composed the leading iron producing region of the world. Many furnace workers lived in company houses, were paid with company script which was spent at the company store.

BOY SCOUTS AND GENEALOGY

Boy Scouts can earn over 100 merit badges and one of them is Genealogy. It was first introduced in 1973 and the first Genealogy Merit Badge Pamphlet was written by an eminent genealogist, Jenn Stryker-Rodda. The latest pamphlet was written by Elizabeth L. Nichols with contributors Jimmy B. Parker, Val D. Greenwood and Glade I. Nelson.

The requirements are as follows:

- . Explain the meaning of genealogy and genealogical resources.
- . Begin a pedigree chart with yourself and fill it in as far as you can at the beginning of your project. Add any additional names, dates, or places that you find.
- . Show yourself as a child on a family group record form, and show one of your parents as a child on another family group record form.
- . Interview an older relative to obtain information about your family. This interview may be in person, by telephone, or by letter. Add any information obtained to your pedigree chart and family group records.
- . Obtain at least one genealogical document showing proof of some information on your pedigree chart or family group records. This document may be located in your home, a courthouse, an archive or library, etc.
- . Tell how you would evaluate genealogical information.
 - a. Do ONE of the following:
 - a. Do a time line for yourself or a close relative.
 - b. Keep a journal for 6 weeks, writing in it at least once weekly.
 - c. Write a short history of yourself or of a close relative.
3. Do ONE of the following:
 - a. Tell how the development of computers is affecting the world of genealogy.
 - b. Tell how the development of photography (including microfilming) has influenced genealogy.
 - c. Tell how personal and family histories have begun to influence the way society looks at local, national, and international history.

9. Contact ONE of the following and ask a question relating to its genealogical services or activities. Report the results.

- a. A lineage society
- b. A surname organization
- c. A professional genealogist
- d. A genealogical education facility or institution.
- e. A genealogical record repository of any type (courthouse, genealogical library, state archives, state library, national archives, etc.)

10. Tell where you would find current information about genealogical records and research methods.

Could you pass the merit badge? You as an individual or your society could perform a service to the Boy Scouts by contacting them and offering to act as a merit badge counselor for Genealogy merit badge. The pamphlet can be obtained from the local Boy Scout distributor in your area. It is a very good "how to" guide for beginners.

The pamphlet presents particularly good comments on the makeup of modern families. Whether young people are living with traditional, blended or one parent families it discusses how to handle step parents, half siblings and step siblings. It makes the point that your pedigree chart and your family group sheet should reflect the family you are comfortable with. It tells when to indicate that a relationship is not bloodline. This is a situation that many young people face today and has been the source of many problems in the school when genealogical projects have been assigned to students.

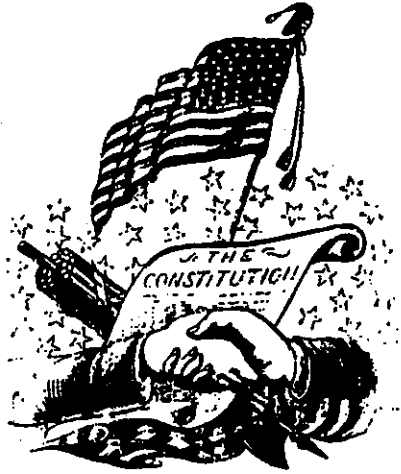
