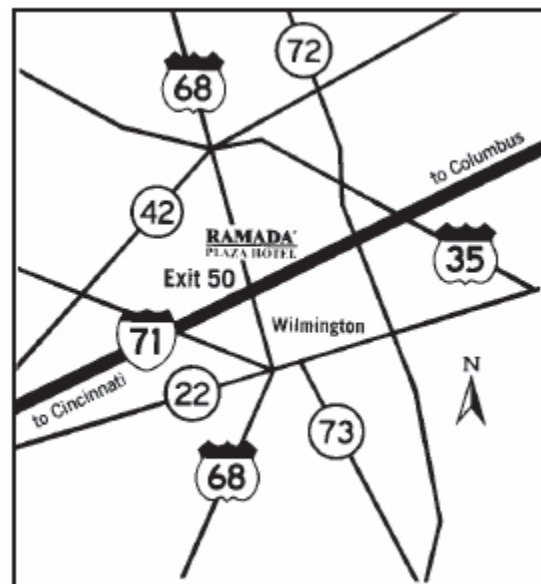

**1895 ENUMERATION— MASON TOWNSHIP**

This is installment #13 in a series that started in Vol. 17 No. 3. This section and the balance of the 1895 Ohio Quadrennial Enumeration is being transcribed by Henry Dillon, a society member who lives in California. Additional sections will appear in future issues as they become available, with three or four pages in each issue of the Lawco Lore until the series is finished. 1895 Quadrennial Enumeration Returns:

Alphabetical List of all Male Habitants above the age of twenty-one years Mason Township, Lawrence County, Ohio, on the day preceding the second Monday of April, A.D. 1895, designating such of them as are of African descent, by the word "Colored." [Transcribed by Henry Dillon. Enumeration transcribed exactly as written with an \* denoting questionable spelling] Proofread against original by Don Clark. Errors are still possible due to bad spots in the microfilming.

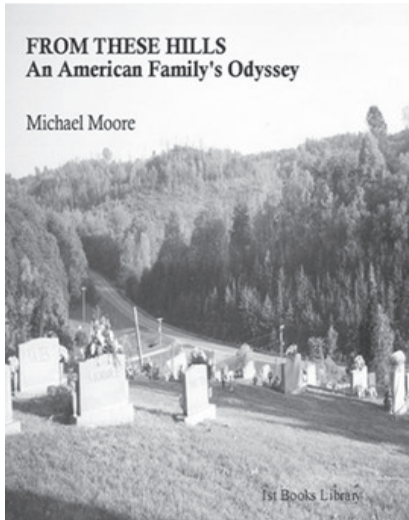

After retiring from Bowling Green State University, Mike and Sue traveled the breadth of the U.S. searching for the truth – from the ruins of the famed Hanging Rock Iron Region where the Yates and Perry families once lived to “Moore country” in the Kentucky and Virginia mountains. From there they journeyed to a potter’s grave in Los Angeles and then back to the Ohio River Valley where it all began. Along the way, they made close friends and discovered relatives whose warmth and acceptance made Mike part of a larger family he had never known.

In tracing that family’s will for over 200 years to endure, the author discovered his place and the meaning of kinship in that odyssey.

## Civil War Soldiers Stories

Continued from last issue

### GEORGE W. FRADD

George W. Fradd was born about 1840 in Lawrence County, Oh, son of John Fradd and Zibia Blowers. On October 1, 1861, he enrolled in Battery B 1st WV Light Artillery. George was discharged January 18, 1864, at Webster, WV, by reason of reenlistment as Veteran Volunteer and was enrolled January 19, 1864, in Battery E 1st WV Light Artillery. George was discharged from that service on June 28, 1865.

On July 4, 1865, he married Catherine Bishop, in Allegany County, Maryland. She was born in Somersetshire, England in June of 1843. Their only child, Anna F. Fradd, was born November 15, 1867, in Ohio. In 1868, George and his family resided in Jackson County, Ohio. He was employed by the Monroe Furnace Company as an iron ore digger. In June of that year, George had some words with a fellow worker named John Lunbarger. As a result, Lunbarger threw a kidney of ore, which struck Fradd in the head. An eyewitness overheard Lunbarger say, "There, I have killed him, sure enough." George was then put in a wagon and carried to his home, where an operation was performed on his skull. George Fradd died within 36 hours and was buried in the vicinity of Monroe Furnace.

A fund was raised to send his widow, Catherine, and their daughter, Anna, back to the home of Catherine's parents in Maryland, and they left Jackson County after a short period of time.

Catherine was employed as both a cook and nurse at the Home of the Friendless in Baltimore, MD. She and Annie remained together, both unmarried, until Catherine's death on December 10, 1930, in Baltimore.

### JOHN FRADD

John Fradd was born about 1835 in Lawrence

County, Ohio, son of John Fradd and Zibia Blowers. John stood six feet two inches and was of fair complexion with light blue eyes and light hair. He married Jane Gillen, July 28, 1860, daughter of Presley Gillen and Agnes DuDuit. Jane gave birth to their first two children, Arminda, about 1857, and Hannah, about 1860. On October 14, 1861, John enlisted in Co. K, 5th Reg. WV Infantry Volunteers and served under the command of Captain Alfred F. Cumpston.

One fall morning in 1862 while camped in Ceredo, West Virginia, John awoke to find his tin cup missing. He asked a fellow soldier named Tolbert Haley if he had taken it, then passed on, saying, "I believe you have my tin cup," when Haley made no reply. John looked back and saw Haley in the act of striking him with his rifle. John quickly turned and caught Haley's gun as other comrades interfered and broke them apart. As John turned again to go on his way, Haley hit Fradd with a brick on the left side of his forehead, fracturing his skull. As a result, he was admitted to a hospital in Gallipolis where he remained unconscious for six weeks. John was discharged on January 27, 1864, but reenlisted on February 29, 1864, with Company K 1st Regiment WV Veterans Infantry Volunteers under the command of Captain Duncan.

John suffered from rheumatism on the raid from the Kanawha Valley to Lynchburg, Virginia, in June 1864. In August, he suffered further disability to his head and eyes, from a sunstroke incurred near South Mountain, Maryland, while on the march from Harper's Ferry, Virginia, to Pennsylvania. On September 3, 1864, John was shot in the left leg at the Battle of Berryville, Virginia. Hence, he was hospitalized at Harper's Ferry, Frederick City, Baltimore, Philadelphia, and Gallipolis for three months. John returned to service afflicted with complications associated with his injuries and illness. He was discharged from military service at McKim's Hospital, Baltimore, Maryland, July 3, 1865.

John and Jane had five more children: John, born about 1866; Jarret, March 13, 1868; George, about 1869; Andrew, February 14, 1870; and, Gearsee, March 11, 1872. After Jane died



in 1872, John married Eliza Dowdy, March 22, 1873, daughter of John and Martha Dowdy. They had the following children: Emma, born between 1873-1878; Charlotte, December 18, 1875; Pierpoint, October 7, 1877; James, September 1878; Nancy Adeline, September 2, 1882; Celia, December 16, 1885; Charles Edward, June 26, 1888; Mary, May 15, 1889; and Benjamin, August 3, 1891. John's wife, Eliza, died January 25, 1895.

On June 6, 1895, John married Mary Jane Tharp Thomas, daughter of Levi Tharp and Mary Adkinson. Those who knew John reported him to be a good man and good soldier. John died August 16, 1896, at the home of Hugh C. Maddy in Rock Camp and is buried in Maddy Cemetery in Fayette Township.

## **FREEMAN FAMILY MEMBERS IN THE CIVIL WAR**

Moses Alfred Freeman, the oldest member of the family to serve, was born April 23, 1816 in Franklin County, VA. On Oct. 29, 1861, he enlisted in Company H, 6<sup>th</sup> Reg., Ohio Cavalry Volunteers. He would receive gunshot wounds to the face on June 21, 1863 at Upperville, VA, which led to his death, at age 47, on Jan. 23, 1864, at General Hospital in Washington DC. His body was returned to Lawrence County for burial on the family farm. Service records show him with blue eyes, sandy hair, and a fair complexion. Several of Moses' nephews would also fight: his brother David's 4 sons; his brother George's 2 sons; his sister Mary/Polly's 2 sons; his sister Susannah's son and son-in-law; and his sister Sarah's son-in-law.

David & Nancy Martin Freeman's son John was born in 1831 in Boyd County, KY; their other sons were born in Lawrence County, James N. Oct 25, 1834, William April 8, 1839 and Moses Alfred Dec. 1841. Moses was captured and had to escape from Andersonville Prison. Not proven yet but his brother John may also have been tak-

en prisoner during the war.

George & Rebecca Brubaker/Winters/Ferguson Freeman's sons were both born in Lawrence County; Camillus "Hall", Nov. 19, 1841, and his younger brother, William Fuston "Fust", March 3, 1847.

Susannah Freeman & John Tatem/Tatum's son William Edward was born March 11, 1830 in Lawrence County. On November 21, 1847, their daughter Virginia married William P. Lynd, who was born May 23, 1825, the son of John and Betsey Pancake Lynd.

Mary/Polly Freeman & Pleasant Alfred Adkins' son William was born Sept. 5, 1831, in Boyd County, KY while younger son Alfred Pleasant was born Sept. 24, 1835, in Lawrence County.

Sarah Freeman & Abraham Ferguson's daughter Susanna Ferguson married on April 5, 1864, Peter W. Leighty, who was born Oct. 5, 1841, in Lawrence County, the son of Joseph and Elizabeth Humphreys Leighty.

- William D Freeman; 21 years, 6' 1 1/2", hazel/fair/auburn, farmer, Illinois, Co. B, 112<sup>th</sup> Infantry;

## **MOSES ALFRED FREEMAN**

Moses Alfred Freeman was born in Franklin County VA on April 23, 1818 son of William and Sarah Parker Freeman. He was married on March 7, 1852, to Jane Stanley 1834-1871, daughter of John & Mary Elizabeth Ellison Stanley, Sr. Their family bible confirms five children were born: Clayton 1852-1930, Isaac 1854-1855, Willis Clinton 1857-1939, Emily 1859-unknown, Marietta 1861-1941.

On October 29, 1861, in Ironton, Ohio at the age of 43, Moses ENROLLED in Co. H, 6th Regiment of the Ohio Cavalry. He served as a Private under J. L. Barber and is described as 5'11 1/2", blue eyes, fair complexion with sandy hair. The price of his uniform was \$8.40 and he was reimbursed for the use of his horse and equipment. His military records indicate he was promoted to the rank of Corporal followed by his request to be reduced back to Private. He received a gunshot "minnie ball" wound to the left face during a skirmish at Upperville, VA on June 21, 1863, was sent to Forrest Hospital DC, and died the following January 23, 1864 in the Camp Stoneman Hospital, Washington D. C. War records reflect that he was transported back to the home farm for burial. Behind the old home place on Willow Creek is the family cemetery where seven graves are marked with fieldstones in McKee Ratliff Cemetery. This cemetery was originally part of the Freeman family farm.

His war papers contain an affidavit that provides proof that Isaac and Jane are both buried on the farm cemetery. Also buried there is Etta Freeman, Clayton's first wife.

To clear some confusion, there were two men

with the name of Moses A Freeman serving in the same unit during the Civil War. The War Dept. separated their records by referring to them as Sr. and Jr. The "Jr." Moses was the Sr.'s nephew who was married to Sarah Ann Romans and was the son of David Parker Freeman.

On June 10, 1872, Clayton G. married Elvira Henrietta "Etta" McKee. Children: Charles [Charlotte Soupene], Emma [E. C. Willis], Mae Euda [Carrico], and Anne [Hastings, Noble.] Etta died on April 17, 1885, and Clayton later was married to Augusta "Gus" McKee. Augusta was born May 5, 1864, daughter of Joe and Parthena Pemberton McKee. Clayton and Augusta had two children: Frank [Nancy Eason] and Bess [H. C. Bowman].

Willis Clinton married Emma Katharine, daughter of David and Susanna Bowman Ankrim. Their only daughter, Loela Mansfield Freeman, was married first to John Creighton Davis. Their only son, J. Creighton Davis, Jr., married Ethyl Boswell and their only son was Ralph Creighton Davis, who married an Owens.

Loela's second marriage was to John William Ross and their only daughter was Anne Catherine, who married Charles A. King.

In 1882 Marietta "Molly" married Lawson Drury Winters, son of George and Eliza Bruce Winters. Children: Pansy [Homer Edwards], Mada, Harlan, Bonnie [George Anderson]. They made their home on Lexington St. in Ashland, KY.
