**THEY WERE BROTHERS AND SOLDIERS FROM LAWRENCE COUNTY**

Lonnie, Harley, Elza, and Wid Delawder, Dewey Derifield and Richard Bowman were their names. They were life long residents of Lawrence County and they served America proudly during World War II. Richard's service was cut short and did not take him to the War Theater. The remaining five, brothers and brother-in-law followed their leaders and our great Red, White and Blue through Africa, Italy, Sicily, France, Germany and Belgium. Collectively, they earned more than 26 Battle Stars and many other medals that included: Good Conduct, American Campaign Medal, World War II Victory Medal, European African Middle Eastern Campaign Medal, Distinguished Unit Badge and the American Theatre Service Medal. Their Rates/Ranks ranged from Private to TEC 4 and 5 and topped off by a couple of Sergeants. Famous and deadly newsreel battles read like Who's Who from the War Theatre --- Battle of the Bulge, Anzio Landing from Sicily into Italy, marching through North Africa, Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland and the Red Ball Express together with Units/Companies like the 99<sup>th</sup> Checkerboard Division, the 622<sup>nd</sup> Medical Clearing Company, and General Mark Clark's Fifth Army. I feel certain that if they were here today they could identify so much more about their war-time experiences. Wid, the youngest of the brothers also served a tour of duty with what was referred to as The 3 C's – the Civilian Conservation Corps before enlisting in the Army.

The men were first and foremost "Family Men" and secondly "Proud Patriots", much like their family ancestors who served their country in the Civil War and the Revolutionary War. They were farmers, factory men, fishermen, hunters, lovers of old cars and the list goes on and on – it is felt that there are very few streams, rivers or fields in Lawrence County that weren't fished or hunted by these caring individuals.

Their families and other descendants salute them for the special role they played in our lives.

## Civil War Soldiers Stories

Continued from last issue

*These stories were submitted for and appear in the History of Lawrence County, Ohio Vol. 2*

### SAMUEL JEFFERSON MORRIS

Private Samuel Jefferson Morris of the 2nd West Virginia Calvary Company B emigrated from Monroe County, Virginia to Lawrence County in 1850. Born on November 25, 1827, Jefferson is the son of William Morris, who died on September 3, 1879, and Elizabeth Harris, who passed away on March 12, 1832, when Jefferson was only 4 years of age.

At the age of 23, Jefferson settled in Decatur Township where he would farm and perform public service for the next 50 years. It was also in Lawrence County where he would marry Maria Smith (b. Jan. 14, 1837). A native of Greenup County, Kentucky, Maria is the oldest daughter of Nancy Staten and John Smith. Like Jefferson, Maria also lost a parent at an early age when her father John passed away on July 10, 1840.

Over the next 20 years Jefferson and Maria would have the following 8 children: Mary E. Morris (b. Feb. 11, 1853, m. unknown Woolum); Sophia Morris (b. Feb. 21, 1858, m. Squire Walters); Nancy "Alice" Morris (b. May 4, 1860, d. Feb. 21, 1906, m. Isaac Newton Day); James S. Morris (b. May 16, 1864, m. Anna unknown); Effie Morris (b. Dec. 19, 1866, m. James Day); Charles Edward Morris (b. Nov. 6, 1872, m. Pina A. Delaney); William H. Morris (b. Nov. 16, 1855, d. May 22, 1857); and John J. Morris (b. Nov. 5, 1869, d. July 20, 1872).

In spite of the fact that he was 34 years old and the father of three small children, Jefferson answered his country's call to arms when he enlisted in the 2nd WVA Calvary on September 1, 1861. He served in Co. B for the next 3 years, participating in many fierce battles throughout his native Virginia. Perhaps his closest call of the war was on June 27, 1863, when he was captured by confederates while on pickett duty at Look Creek, WVA. After he was captured, he was transported to the notorious Libbey Prison in Richmond. Fortunately, he had to endure only 5 days in the prison before being paroled. After his

release, Jefferson rejoined his regiment and continued fighting with Company B until he was honorably discharged on November 29, 1864.

Returning to his Decatur Township farm after the war, Jefferson became a leading member of the community; serving 2 terms as a trustee; 6 years as constable; and 4 years as Director of Schools.

Surprisingly, after having lived in Decatur Township for over 50 years, Jefferson and Maria left their farm and moved to Portsmouth sometime during the early 1900's. It was there that Jefferson died on August 6, 1916 at the age of 89 years. Maria passed away a year later on November 13, 1917. They are both buried on Soldier's Circle N.W. Quadrant at Portsmouth's Greenlawn Cemetary.

### WILLIAM L MORRIS

William L Morris was born 11 Aug 1840, Monroe Co, OH. He was the son of Elisha and Ellen/Eleanor Dillon. Elisha died about 1844-45, and by June 1846, Ellen had remarried to Joshua Capper. Joshua and Ellen Capper, with all their children, were in Windsor Twp. for the 1850 census. William married Louisa J Dunfee, 12 Sep 1861. She was a daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth Coon, born 3 Sep 1841 in Belmont Co, OH.

William L Morris was a private in Co. E, 173<sup>rd</sup> OVI, who entered service at Gallipolis, 18 Sep 1864, when 24 years old. He was mustered out at Nashville, 26 June 1865. He appears on the 1890 Special Census.

William and Louisa were the parents of:

# SPIRIT OF THE TIMES.

IRONTON OHIO. WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 5, 1853.

The above is the banner line for the first issue of a weekly newspaper that appeared in Iron-  
ton starting with Vol. 1 No. 1, on Wednesday, January 5, 1853. The Hamner Room acquired a mi-  
crofilm copy of the available issues from the Ohio Historical Society. The last issue on the film is for  
Vol. 3, No. 52, on Tuesday, January 29, 1856.

A quick scan of some of the issues found the local content of this four page paper to be most-  
ly ads for Ironton merchants and legal notices. There is a very small amount of local news.

On page three of the first issue is an account of the accidental death by drowning, of Hugh  
Crawford of Ironton, who was at that time Lawrence Co. Sheriff. On the Monday of the previous  
week, he and some others were nine miles above Cincinnati, attempting to tie off a flat boat of iron  
on the Kentucky shore during a storm. His ankle became entangled in a coil of rope. He and the  
others were unable to release him before he was dragged into the river and drowned. Unfortunatel-  
y, this obituary is like many others of this era, with many flowery phrases but few details, such as  
the names of his widow and any other surviving family.

### ***New Post Rout to Galipolis***

*A few days since we met our friend Elza Willis circulating a Petition to the Post office depart-  
ment for the establishment of a mail rout from this place to Galipolis. When we saw it, the petition  
numerously signed, and we understand that many additions have since been made to the petition-  
ers.*

*Perhaps there is no county in the State so poorly supplied with mail facilities as Lawrence.  
The proposed rout to Galipolis via Hecla Furnace, Ice creek, Marion and Greasy Ridge, if estab-  
lished, will supply a large number of our citizens with mail matter who are now without any mail ac-  
commodations whatever. From the known energy of Mr. Willis in whatever he undertakes, and from  
the efforts of Mr. John N. Clark whjo is interesting himself for the same purpose, in Gallia, which will  
be as much benefited as Lawrence, by the success of the enterprize; and also from the urgent ne-  
cessity of such a rout we are led to believe the measure will succeed—*

The 2005 program features several nationally known lecturers, including John Colletta, PhD, who will share his knowledge with attendees on the subjects of passenger arrival records, researching in the Library of Congress, and researching Italian ancestry. Altogether, the program for the three-day conference includes 34 speakers presenting a total of 56 lectures on a broad array of topics. The program also includes four two-hour workshops on April 14.

At the conference, the society will be inducting OGS members into three lineage societies: **The First Families of Ohio**; **The Society of Civil War Families of Ohio**; and the **Settlers and Builders of Ohio**. FFO inductees will have proved lineage from settlers in Ohio before 1820, and SBO inductees will have proven their lineage from residents of the state before 1860. SCWFO inductees will have proven their lineage from Civil War veterans, either Union or Confederate, who either lived in Ohio or served in Ohio units.

The 2005 Conference and accompanying exhibition will be held at the Quaker Square Convention Center in downtown Akron.

The adjoining Crowne Plaza Hotel will serve as the headquarters hotel for the conference.
