ROCK CAMP, LAWRENCE COUNTY, OHIO

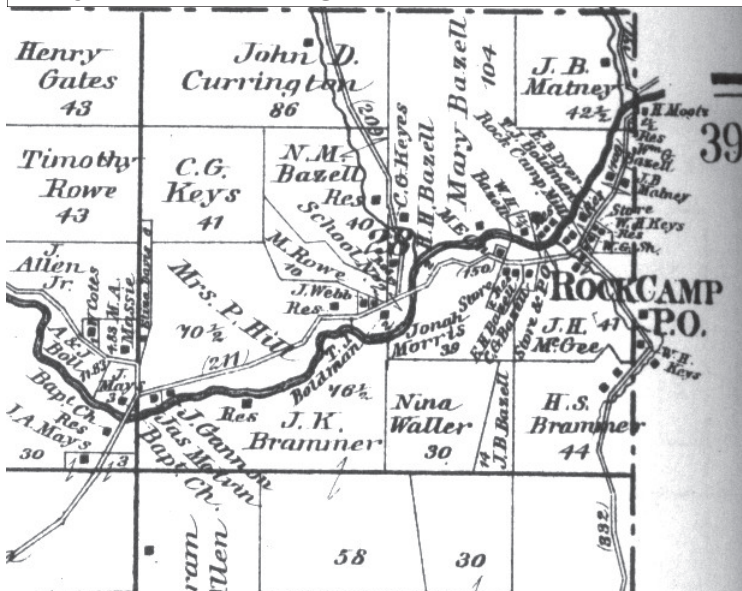

Rock Camp is in Perry Township, Range 17, Township 3, Section 28. It is three miles north of Deering, on County Rd 6. In this view: East is at the bottom, and West at the top. The M. E. Church is the building with the bell tower, located between the road and a loop of Ice Creek.

The original, on canvas, has suffered some minor water damage. It was donated by Mr. George Bruce, and is on display in the Hamner Room. This image was obtained using a 3 mega-pixel digital camera, with the flash disabled.

Ahnentafel

Comments received with a members renewal, indicate that some of you may not understand what an Ahnentafel is. If you will look at a standard five generation chart, you will notice that each space is numbered. If you are #1 on the chart, your father is #2, and your mother #3, Your grandparents are #'s 4-7, grt grandparents #'s 8-15, and so on. In all cases, a persons number times two, is their father, and times two plus one is their mother. An Ahnentafel is a way to list your ancestors, without the space wasting charts. The numbering system will match the first chart, but will skip what would be blank spaces on a multiple chart array. All genealogy programs I have tried, can generate this list and do the numbering for you. It might be called an narrative report or a book, but it will list your ancestors in this way. I prefer to use this format in the Lore, because I can get more info in the space available.

Ohio Penitentiary Fire - Monday April 21, 1930

This large fire resulted in 319-322 deaths. The exact number is unknown due to the confusion immediately after the fire. The ability to identify badly damaged bodies was limited at that time. There were a few deaths of Lawrence Co. men in this fire, but the exact number is in question. One who was reported as dead, and issued a death certificate, was **ALBERT GOTLIED WALK**. He was born in Ohio ca 1896, married at 19, in 1915, and in 1930 was tried and convicted in Lawrence Co for manufacturing intoxicant liquor. On March 27 he was received at the Ohio Pen as inmate 61796, to start his 1 to 5 year sentence. Only a month later he "died in the fire, was issued death certificate 1930-23092, and on April 26 was buried in East Lawn cemetery in Columbus."

Fortunately he had a second chance. He was paroled on July 12, 1931, and his release was final on Aug. 15, 1931. In 1935 he was living in Ironton, working as a laborer, and rooming at 405 S 11th St. In 1954 he had a home on Scioto Ave. In 1958 and 1960, city directories show his home as 1205 N 5th St. This entry, 30 years after the state declared him dead, was his last entry. He was not listed in 1963 or later. The Ironton Tribune of that time reported on the fire, and that the reported death of Albert Walk was unfounded. If the death certificate was issued in error, it needs to be corrected and an effort made to properly identify the person buried in that grave.

WILSON - BRAMBLE

Looking for information on the family of Henry and Elizabeth BRAMBLE WILSON. Any pictures, bible records, etc. would be welcomed. Henry Wilson was b. ca 1813 in Morgantown, VA, d. 12 April 1870. He married Elizabeth Bramble on 28 Dec. 1832. She was b. in Oct. 1812 in Ohio, d. after 1880. Their children were: Elizabeth Wilson, b. 18 Feb. 1836, Newark, OH; Edward S Wilson, b. ca 1842, Newark, OH; Albert Wilson, b. ca 1844, Newark, OH; Henry Bramble Wilson, b. ca 1847, Newark, OH; and Samantha Wilson, b. ca 1850 Newark, OH. Everything I have discovered says this is part of my family but I would like some direct proof. The fact that Henry's son is named Henry Bramble Wilson and the census records I have are good but not enough.

The family seems to have been leading citizens and were in the news a lot. Henry was reported to be the first mayor of Ironton. I am not sure all of my information is correct, as little is documented. I am trying to prove relationships.
