The New OGS Logo



In 2007 the Ohio Genealogical Society adopted a new updated logo. This is the Lawrence County specific version. The old logo featured the Ohio state flag and a buckeye with the group name in a small font within the triangle. This did identify our group as an Ohio organization, but without the name, did not suggest genealogy. We retained the triangle from the old logo, enlarged the font and curved it around the art, added the state outline for locale identity, and added the oak tree that suggests looking to our roots.

We will use this new logo in some instances, but will continue to use the Lawrence County Seal in most cases.
